- EU crisis management system focuses on fastburning crises, excelling in particular sectors and with very limited cross-sectoral capacity.
- Looming problem of slow-burning crises, which requires expert consensus + EU agencies (or other governance arrangements) support.
- EU vs. Member States interests are key.







## **ENLIGTHEN & TRANSCRISIS - JOINT LESSONS**

Crisis governance strongest on international and European market and macro-economic issues.

EU Law provides a foundation to judge crisis dynamics, but open to contestation.

Is weakest on issues seen as national (demographic change, social housing, and others).







Tensions between Law, Market, and Society exist within the European Union.

Most likely to emerge where there are policy blind-spots, or with nationalist identities.

In these cases policy backsliding is more likely.

Innovative modes of EU governance are required.







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
